

Exploring and Employing Autoethnographic Positioning Analysis

Whether you're just starting to explore autoethnographic research or wish to deepen your understanding of Autoethnographic Positioning Analysis (APA), this workshop offers a space for shared learning and methodological reflection. The atmosphere will be collaborative and open, encouraging exchange, experimentation, and collective inquiry.

We will begin with a brief introduction to APA, outlining its conceptual roots and analytical potential. Building on this foundation, the core of the workshop consists of five interactive sessions, each centered around a different research project. In these sessions, five invited participants will introduce their work and share how they connect their data and questions to APA. Together, we will work directly with materials, explore positioning-analytical perspectives, and reflect on the role of self, narrative, and social dynamics in ethnographic research.
