- Excellent oral and written communication skills in German and English
- Given the international focus of the project, knowledge of other languages is an advantage

- Involvement in the implementation of the international research project "Life strategies of Young Labour Migrants in Ageing Societies" (LYMAS), in particular the collection, processing and analysis of qualitative data (interviews, digital diaries, ethnographic research methods).
- Collaboration with the international team of researchers involved in the project
- Publications in the form of articles in peer-reviewed journals, reports and other specialist publications
- Participation in academic and stakeholder events in Germany and abroad
- Support in the organisation of team workshops and conferences
- Linking the project work with a suitable doctoral project at the Humboldt University of Berlin in the Faculty of Cultural, Social and Educational Sciences.



Further requirements

You have relevant research experience (ideally international) and have experience in preparing scientific results for professional audiences, the media or the general public. A high degree of organisational ability as well as a high degree of perceptiveness and flexibility. Very good German and English skills are essential, other languages are desirable.

What we offer

The position is initially limited to **three years** on the basis of the Wissenschaftszeitvertragsgesetz (WissZeitVG). Remuneration is in accordance with remuneration **group/scale E13 TVöD**. Place of work is Berlin.
