


Bielefeld University has the following **two** job openings within the InChangE joint project:

In the joint project "Individualisation in Changing Environments" (InChangE) funded by the Ministry of Culture and Science of the state of NRW, the Universities of Münster and Bielefeld explore causes, mechanisms and effects of individualisation in changing environments in an interdisciplinary discourse of natural sciences, social sciences and humanities. The disciplines represented in the joint project are biology, philosophy, sociology, economics, psychology, geoinformatics, psychiatry and health sciences (https://www.uni-muenster.de/JICE/en/projekte/inchange.html).
