LeTs-Care: LEARNING FROM LONG-TERM CARE PRACTICES FOR THE EUROPEAN CARE STRATEGY

Project summary: European societies find themselves in a window of opportunity for the advancement of Long Term Care (LTC) policies and practices. LeTs-Care originally combines an analysis of territorial (local and national) indicators and Case Study analysis to provide a new, in-depth, reflexive understanding of LTC challenges and their diversity across 7 European countries. It will disentangle the meanings of taken-for-granted LTC concepts and illuminate how, e.g., “care” or “integrated care” have different meanings in different contexts. It will produce new evidence and a novel approach to territorial inequalities in LTC, their drivers and interdependencies. LeT’s-Care will move beyond “best practices” by developing a new, reflexive approach to policy learning and a concrete toolkit.
